CANCELLATION POLICY

- If registration is cancelled at least 30 days prior to the first day of the class/camp session, a 100% tuition refund (minus \$30 processing fee) will be issued.
- If registration is cancelled 15-29 days prior to the first day of the class/camp session, a 50% tuition refund will be issued.
- If registration is cancelled within 14 days or less prior to the first day of the class/camp session, no tuition refund will be issued.

Arts for All of Northern Michigan is dedicated to providing an excellent summer camp experience for our participants. To accomplish this goal, participants are expected to behave appropriately and promote a safe, fun, and healthy environment. Our goal is to promote character values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility in all aspects of our summer camp program. We ask that all participants and parents/guardians read this code together before arriving at camp. As a participant, I will: **RESPECT** • Be respectful, cooperative and will contribute positively to the experience of fellow participants. • Be careful and considerate that my actions will not hurt another participant's feelings or hurt them physically, either intentionally or accidentally. • Show respect to the camp staff and cooperate fully with their instructions. Always follow directions. • Respect the rights and beliefs of others and treat others with courtesy and consideration. • Respect the property of others. **PERSONAL SPACE AND PROPERTY** • Be respectful of all camp property and equipment/supplies. • Never mark, deface, or destroy our summer camp space/equipment or personal property. **BEHAVIOR** • Conduct myself responsibly. I understand that horseplay, unwelcome teasing/bullying, or any unkind behavior is not allowed and will not be tolerated. • Communicate in an appropriate manner, which means I will not use foul language, gestures, or harsh words. I will not raise my voice or use verbal threats of any kind. • Refrain from deliberately causing bodily harm to the participants or staff. I understand that pushing, kicking, hitting, or fighting are not acceptable behavior. This behavior will not be tolerated and will be grounds for suspension/dismissal from the camp program. (Continued on next page) (Summer Camp Code of Conduct – continued) **SAFETY** • Participants must have a pair of closed toe shoes at camp. • Participants need to pay attention to their surroundings and use care in all activities. • Participants will adhere to all safety rules and regulations given for each activity that he/she participates in while at camp. **GENERAL** • Participants must inform the camp staff if they experience a problem with another participant or other issues. If a staff member is not informed about a problem, they cannot assist the participant or stop the problem. • We hope that all participants will have **FUN!** • Participants are encouraged to participate in activities to the best of their ability. • Violation of the Code of Conduct can be grounds for disciplinary actions including but not limited to automatic suspension/dismissal. Refunds are not given when a participant is suspended or dismissed from the camp program. • Weapons, look-alike weapons, or objects that may be used to threaten, intimidate, or harm others or to damage property may not be brought to camp. • Cell phones are to be silenced during Summer Camp Activity hours (9 am to Noon) and kept out of sight in a bag or pocket during class time. • Each participant is to bring their own water bottle to class.
